Daily Readings Week 2

MONDAY 07.012.21 Psalm 32

In this Psalm, the Psalmist speaks of the blessing of forgiveness. The psalm moves from negative effects of sin to relief that comes from confession and God's forgiveness. Reflect on your need for forgiveness and spend time in personal confession.

TUESDAY 07.13.21 Psalm 42

Sometimes we feel down and our soul needs to be refreshed. In this Psalm, the answer to a downcast soul is to "Hope in God." (vs. 5 & 11) In what ways can our souls feel downcast? How does our faith in God give us hope?

WEDNESDAY 07.014.21 Psalm 56

THURSDAY 07.15.21 Psalm 61

While verse 6 & 7 in Psalm 61 refer to the king, this is not a royal psalm, but an individual prayer for protection. God is our protector, our refuge and strong tower (v. 3) in times of need. What do you need refuge from and how does God shelter you in the midst of turmoil? (v.4)

FRIDAY 07.16.21 Psalm 67

Psalm 67 is a prayer of blessing. The language of plural pronouns (us) suggests this a communal (community) psalm used in public worship. It demonstrates God's desire to bless not only Israel, but all nations (v. 2). Verse 1 is reminiscent of the priestly benediction of Aaron (Num. 6:24-26). Take time to think of God's blessings in your life and praise God for those blessings (v. 5).

SATURDAY 07.17.21 Psalm 75

Psalm 75 is a psalm of thanksgiving for God's sovereignty. While the wicked may seem to get away with evil, this Psalm reminds us that God will judge with equity (v. 2). God's judgement is good because the wicked will be brought down (v. 7) and the righteous exalted (v. 10). How does knowing God is the final judge put this life in perspective?

**THURSDAY 07.15.21 Psalm 61**

While verse 6 & 7 in Psalm 61 refer to the king, this is not a royal psalm, but an individual prayer for protection. God is our protector, our refuge and strong tower (v. 3) in times of need. What do you need refuge from and how does God shelter you in the midst of turmoil? (v.4)

FRIDAY 07.16.21 Psalm 67
